What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Conservative fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. AMP Wealth Management New Zealand Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund has a well-diversified portfolio that primarily invests in lower-risk income assets with a conservative allocation to growth assets. The fund aims to achieve modest to medium returns, in exchange there may be small movements up and down in the value of your investments.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Conservative fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

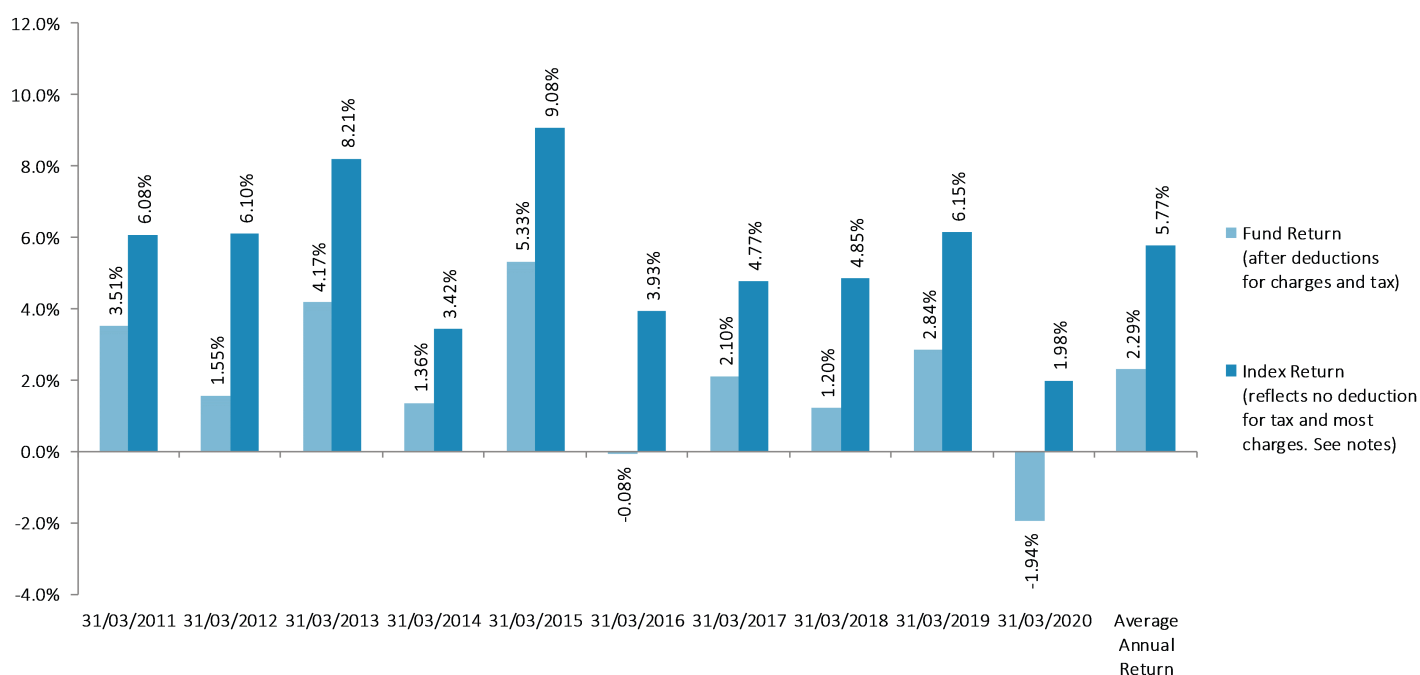
Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.

How has the fund performed?

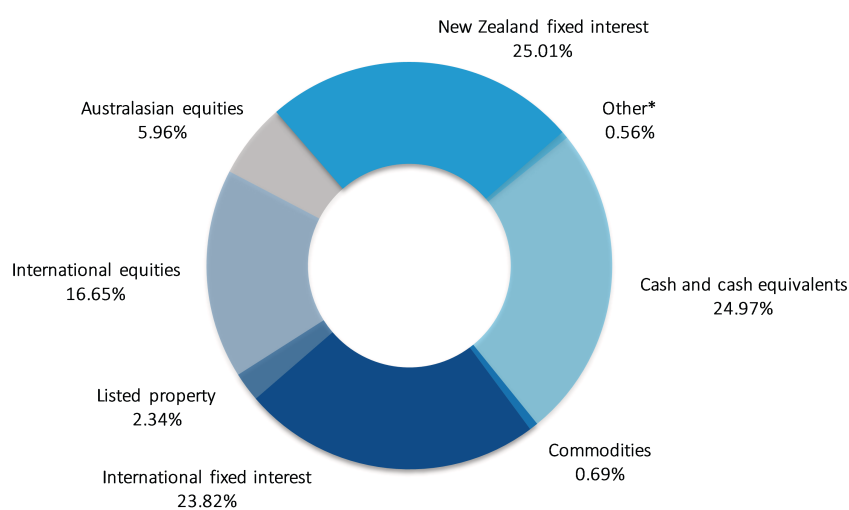
Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$51.00 (that is -0.51% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$37.30 in other charges. This gives Craig a total loss after tax of \$88.30 for the year.

The fund will (or will invest in underlying funds that will) hedge foreign currency exposure for all asset classes, with the exception of International equities – Emerging markets, where currency exposure will be unhedged, and Australasian equities and International equities – Developed markets, where currency exposure is actively managed.

Notes

- 1 We have used a composite index to prepare the table and bar graph, as there was no market index available for some of the relevant assets. The composite index is calculated using the target investment mix weightings of the underlying market and peer group indices for the asset classes that the fund invests into.
